15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

The affiliating university creates the course structure and academic teaching-learning content in accordance with UGC rules. In order to make our students more competent and employable, our affiliated university is also aiming to successfully adopt interdisciplinary, and multidisciplinary education. Ours is a divyangjan friendly campus and has three postgraduate programmes and seven undergraduate programmes. The College ensures that the curriculum focuses 1. on cross-cutting issues while promoting value-based education, gender sensitization, and awareness of environmental protection and sustainability. 2. The college has pedagogical

methods on educational initiative programs and continues assessment. 3. Students are provided with outreach programs, internships, social sensitization camps, industry visits, and outbound training, among other opportunities, to provide them with real-world experiences and exposure to a range of scenarios and decision-making practices. 4. The faculty members of the institution have created the curriculum and assessment framework for the numerous industry-driven and career-focused add-on courses. 5. Online learning systems like Swayam NPTEL, Coursera etc encourage students to enroll in and successfully finish courses. 6. Programs such as workshops and Seminars are also held with an interdisciplinary focus. 7. Participation in sports, the arts, and the National Service Scheme (NSS), integrating insights from various fields, these approaches foster holistic development, encouraging students to cultivate a diverse skill set that enhances creativity and teamwork. 8. The Santhigiri Interdisciplinary Research Centre (SIRC) facilitates high-quality academic research by establishing a research ecosystem. 9. The Santhigiri Hub for Innovation and Promotion (SHIP) fosters an innovative and entrepreneurial culture among students by providing them with necessary resources and assistance to realize their ideas. 10. Santhisoft Technologies, the college's research and development division, also conducts application development and serves as a live lab for the students aids in promoting Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary Projects for Undergraduates and Post graduates

16. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Santhigiri College of Computer Sciences is a higher education institution affiliated to MG University, Kottayam, and approved by AICTE, Delhi. Since the necessary statutory changes have not been made by the University, college is not registered with the Academic Bank of Credits as the existing Choice-based Credit Semester system (CBCS) lacks the flexibility to allow students to benefit from multiple entry and exits within the selected program. The Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) was created with the goal of enabling students to freely study at any of the nation's higher education institutions by providing a suitable system for transferring credits between programs. According to the National Education Policy 2020, ABC is intended. The necessary statutory changes have not been implemented by the University. However, the institutional processes required for ABC's proper implementation have been established through: 1. A session on NEP 2020 was conducted for faculty members at the beginning of the academic year to familiarize them with the policy's key reforms and ensure effective implementation in teaching and learning practices. 2. Santhigiri College is authorized NPTEL Local chapter. 3. We recommend our students to enroll in NPTEL courses as

well as courses offered by Coursera. 3. IQAC often takes initiatives in providing sessions on Information and Communication Technology resources as part of continuous improvement and the effective use of technology in education

17.Skill development:

Placement and Employability skills training sessions are offering to equip students with essential skills and knowledge to enhance their employability, including resume writing, interview preparation, and professional communication. Yoga sessions are offered by college to enhance student skills such as concentration, mindfulness, and stress management, which are beneficial for both personal and professional development. A session on Holistic Education, communication skills in English, and various add-on courses like Data analysis using excel, Hospitality management, Folk Dance Training, Participatory Rural Appraisal, Logic building using pseudo Code, Web application development with Angular and Node.JS, Data Visualization in Python, Core Python Tkinter are offered to students, aiming to improve their overall personality, academic performance, and employability. These initiatives focus on enhancing soft skills, fostering personal growth, and preparing students for diverse challenges in both professional and personal spheres. The Santhigiri Hub for innovation and Promotion (SHIP) of the college has encourages innovation and idea generation skills in students. The Santhigiri College Outreach Program (SCOP) focused on holistic development, which includes skill development, community outreach, and practical learning experiences. The Santhigiri Interdisciplinary Research Center (SIRC) focuses on skill-oriented academic activities, fostering practical learning and collaboration. Its initiatives enhance students' research capabilities and prepare them for real-world challenges. Success Day is celebrated in colleges to recognize and honor the achievements of students, faculty, and staff, fostering a culture of excellence and motivation. It also highlights the importance of skills development, encouraging students to strive for continuous personal and academic growth. Women Cell of Santhigiri college offered Skill orientation program on Self-defence for girl students. Students enrolled in certain programs that offer hands-on training to build professional skills necessary for employment are expected to visit the industry. The institute offers career counselling, entrepreneurship development programs, and skill development programs like tube and bulb making, Social Work Department, in association with the NSS organized a "Best Out of Waste", "haritha karma sena", "sneharamam" etc, to program to promote creativity, environmental awareness, and resourcefulness among students, Department of Commerce in

collaboration with Nirmala College Muvattupuzha organized skill sharing program in statistics

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

Incorporating the Indian knowledge system fosters students' sense of pride and identity while also protecting and honouring the country's cultural legacy. The ways Institution has made great progress in incorporating Indian Knowledge Systems into curriculum are: With an emphasis on the value of regional and national languages, the affiliating university provides courses in Malayalam and Hindi as part of its undergraduate curriculum. By honouring numerous traditional and cultural holidays and occasions like youth skill day, liberty fest, observing gandhian values on gandhijayanti, onam etc celebrates India's cultural diversity. All departments include yoga in their curriculum, with students receiving instruction from the skilled and knowledgeable yoga guru, Ms. Saraswathi Antherjanam, in various yoga poses, pranayamas, mudra healing, and other techniques. College Library play a crucial role in gaining knowledge about the Indian Knowledge System by providing access to diverse resources, preserving ancient texts, supporting research, fostering community engagement and interdisciplinary learning. The college encourages bilingual instruction teaching methods so that slow learners can grasp the content. The college hosts a number of programs to increase students' understanding of Indian customs and culture.

19.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

In accordance with the guidelines set forth by Mahatma Gandhi University in Kottayam, Kerala, Santhigiri College has introduced the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in all undergraduate and graduate programs. In order to effectively implement and administer the curriculum and develop students' social commitment, employability, innovation, and research orientation, the college has well-structured Outcome Based Education (OBE) methods. The institution utilizes the Accredited 360 software to map Course Outcomes (COs) to Programme Outcomes (POs) and Programme Specific Outcomes (PSOs) through CO-PO and CO-PSO matrices. This comprehensive tool generates consolidated mapping and attainment levels for each course within a program, allowing for precise evaluation at the end of each semester. The college has conducted sessions aimed at enhancing faculty members' understanding of Outcome-Based Education (OBE) and its practical implementation. One session focused on the integration of essential AI tools for teachers using Accredited software, helping faculty better align their

teaching methods with measurable learning outcomes and accreditation standards. Accreditation software facilitates the efficient mapping of Program Outcomes (POs) and Program Specific Outcomes (PSOs), enabling educators to track and ensure that their courses meet the required criteria for academic excellence. Another session specifically concentrated on the process of PO-PSO mapping, guiding faculty on how to effectively link program goals with course objectives. This alignment not only ensures that students acquire the desired skills and knowledge but also helps in continuous improvement and better alignment with industry standards. By combining OBE principles with advanced AI tools, these sessions empower faculty to create more personalized, effective, and outcome-driven learning experiences for students.

20.Distance education/online education:

The college has been incorporating ICT-enabled tools into its regular classroom instruction. The advantages of digital learning are maximized in online education. Understanding the importance and demand for online teaching-learning techniques, Santhigiri College started implementing the latest blended learning trends by integrating instruction with digital tools and resources that were created to provide the best learning environment possible within the college. EMBASE Pro Suit software enhances communication among administrators, tutors, students, and parents by providing real-time, error-free updates on IAEs, attendance, and assessments, all conducted efficiently online. The practical's and lab sessions were conducted on virtual platforms, which assisted students in staying engaged and learning despite being absent from classrooms. By giving the college community centralized access to SGCL library catalogue a wide range of resources, such as e-books, scholarly journals, research papers, and multimedia materials, digital libraries enable the college community to access online content. As Santhigiri college being the local chapter of SWAYAM NPTEL, portal is also used by educators and learners to access online resources related to their areas. This aids in keeping them informed about the discipline's current state. Platforms like courses on platforms like Coursera, udemy etc, further supporting academic and career growth.

Beginning of Academic year,an Academic calendar is structured with examination details, curricular, co-curricular and extracurricular activities. The Department level academic plan is prepared with department activities. It is then compiled into the Department calendar which is published in the Students' Manual. Every newly joined teacher receives an instructional guide, the Teachers manual. Subject allocation is made by the principal for the faculty members based on their choice and area of interest or expertise. The HODs prepare the Timetable prior to the commencement of the semester in accordance with the guidelines of the syllabus. Course Plans are designed by the HODs and faculties prepare their Course File, which contains details of OBE, attendance, assignment submission, seminar presentation, project, Internal Assessment Evaluations, remedial classes as well as Result Analysis. Department meetings are conducted twice a month. The performance of students is assessed through Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE). Internal Assessment Examinations (IAE)

are conducted to evaluate student performance. The Exam Grievance System in the college resolves the students' queries regarding internal assessment which can't be handled by course teachers. Class wise PTA meetings are conducted to analyse the progress of students. IQAC ensures schedules on curriculum Feedback from the stakeholders.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

The institution's internal assessment mechanism is transparent and adheres to university guidelines, focusing on attendance, writing skills, presentation skills, and knowledge through tests. Students are informed of evaluation procedures via circulars, the college calendar, and the student manual. A seven-member Examination Committee oversees the Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) process, conducting two centralized internal exams each semester, with schedules published in advance.

The exam process includes uniform question papers, timely evaluation, and feedback opportunities for students. A three-level grievance redressal mechanism (department, college, and university levels) is established, with roles outlined in the college handbook. Answer scripts are stored securely for future reference, and internal mark lists are prepared for student monitoring of attendance and performance.

Additionally, students can improve their scores through designated improvement exams. To maintain academic integrity, CCTVs are installed in examination halls. Various assessment methods are encouraged, including quizzes and online assignments. Internal mark forms are systematically prepared and validated before submission to the university portal. Open house programs facilitate discussions on academic performance, ensuring comprehensive student engagement in the assessment process.

Santhigiri College has established a transparent, time-bound, and efficient mechanism to address internal examination-related grievances. Following the evaluation of various internal assessment components, teachers discuss the results with students, providing constructive feedback to help them understand their performance and areas for improvement. This open dialogue ensures that students gain clarity on their marks and the evaluation criteria. Additionally, teachers are available to address any queries or concerns students may have, promoting a supportive environment for academic growth. This feedback process enhances fairness and accountability, reinforcing students' trust in the internal assessment system and aiding in their continuous improvement.

The institution implements a Three-Level Grievance Redressal Mechanism to address student concerns effectively. Students can submit a Grievance Redressal Application Form for any issues related to Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) marks.

Students initially approach Level 1, the Department Level, chaired by the Head of the Department. If grievances remain unresolved the students can approach the College Level, where a committee led by the principal. Finally, Level 3 is the University Level, which involves a committee chaired by the Vice-Chancellor. This structured approach ensures that students have multiple avenues for redressal, promoting a fair and transparent educational environment.

Each department has developed Programme Outcomes (POs) and Programme Specific Outcomes (PSOs) aligned with the learning objectives in the university syllabus. POs outline the essential knowledge, skills, and attitudes graduates should possess upon completion, while PSOs detail the specific competencies expected from graduates of each program. Course Outcomes (COs) are defined in consultation with faculty and specify what students should achieve by studying individual courses.

The Mahatma Gandhi University website displays POs, PSOs, and COs for postgraduate programs, while undergraduate programs; COs, POs and PSOs are created by departments, as these are not included in the syllabus. The well-defined outcomes help students meet industry standards and develop necessary skills and knowledge.

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) organizes workshops on Outcome-Based Education (OBE) to familiarize faculty with Bloom's Taxonomy and outcome mapping. POs, PSOs, and COs are outlined in the student manual and explained during departmental orientation meetings.

To measure attainment levels, the institution formally defines outcomes, setting a minimum of five COs per course. Achievement is evaluated through various assessment methods, with numerical values assigned to track student progress and program effectiveness, facilitating targeted improvements for future academic planning.

2.6.2 - Attainment of Programme outcomes and course outcomes are evaluated by the institution.

The institution utilizes the Accredited 360 software to map Course Outcomes (COs) to Programme Outcomes (POs) and Programme Specific Outcomes (PSOs) through CO-PO and CO-PSO matrices. This comprehensive tool generates consolidated mapping and attainment levels for each course within a program, allowing for precise evaluation at the end of each semester.

Accredited 360 features a well-defined Outcome-Based Education (OBE) evaluation method, including a mark sheet, mapping sheet, and output sheet. The mark sheet consolidates results for internal and external assessments, where internal marks are calculated based on attendance, assignments, and internal exams, following a 20:80 weightage ratio.

Attainment levels are categorized as follows: Level 0 (Not Attained), Level 1 (50% of students meet the cut-off), Level 2 (60% meet the cut-off), and Level 3 (70% meet the cut-off). The mapping sheet assesses CO-PO and CO-PSO correlations on a scale from 1 to 3, indicating slight to substantial contributions.

At the semesters end, course outcomes and attainment levels are analysed by subject in-charges and discussed in departmental meetings to inform future improvements and remedial actions. This structured approach ensures continuous enhancement of educational quality.

4.3 - IT Infrastructure

4.3.1 - Institution frequently updates its IT facilities including Wi-Fi

The college has successfully incorporated cutting-edge IT techniques with 100 Mbps and anticipates complete automation of the college's everyday operations. IT is integrated into the academic, administrative, and admissions processes to make them simpler, more effective, and more transparent. All systems are provided with internet connectivity. The broadband connections currently in use are Kerala Vision with a speed of 300 Mbps, and the Jio connection comes with a speed of 50 Mbps. The BSNL connection, which is an NMECT connection (as part of the National Mission for Education provided by the central government to educational institutions), comes with a speed of 10 Mbps. Santhigiri College's Arts Cell, in collaboration with different cells, organized JYOTHIRGAMAYA 2024, a four-day Arts Festival. The event aimed to showcase students' creativity and talents through 41 events, including off-stage (February 5th and 6th) and on-stage (February 8th and 9th) performances at the Indoor Stadium, Main Auditorium, Seminar Hall, and classrooms. Santhigiri conducts regular performance appraisals for faculty and non-teaching staff to enhance quality and effectiveness. At the start of each academic year, faculty receives a Teacher's Manual outlining responsibilities, lesson plans, and self-appraisal

forms. Faculty completes these forms every semester, which are reviewed by department heads and submitted to the Principal for evaluation. Students provide confidential feedback once per semester through an online/offline system, with the Principal reviewing scores, particularly if they fall below 2.5. Peer evaluations also offer confidential feedback on teaching performance. Self-appraisals, mandatory for all faculty, cover teaching methods, compliance, and community involvement, with the Principal compiling a report on strengths and areas for improvement, shared during management meetings. Based on appraisal results, the Faculty Excellence Award is presented annually to recognize outstanding contributions in teaching, research, mentoring, and community service. The Extra Mile Award is also given to faculty who demonstrate exceptional organizational citizenship behavior. Non-teaching staff are evaluated annually through surveys and informal meetings, with the principal monitoring performance and addressing issues as needed. Both faculty and non-teaching staff are encouraged to engage in professional development opportunities to continuously enhance their skills and effectiveness, reinforcing the institution's commitment to fostering a supportive and growth-oriented environment

For projects funded by non-government agencies, separate bank accounts are opened by the project investigators. These accounts are also audited internally, with

external auditors reviewing the documents upon project completion for submission to the respective funding agencies.

An external audit is conducted annually by a Chartered Accountant appointed by the Managing Board. At the start of the financial year, the Bursar prepares a detailed budget proposal, covering income and expenses for all departments, which is submitted to the management for approval. After reviewing and correcting any discrepancies, the external auditor provides a consolidated audit report. All utilization certificates are signed off by the Chartered Accountant. No major audit objections have been raised during the year, confirming the institution's commitment to financial integrity and compliance.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

The institution's internal assessment mechanism is transparent and adheres to university guidelines, focusing on attendance, writing skills, presentation skills, and knowledge through tests. Students are informed of evaluation procedures via circulars, the college calendar, and the student manual. A seven-member Examination Committee oversees the Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) process, conducting two centralized internal exams each semester, with schedules published in advance.

The exam process includes uniform question papers, timely evaluation, and feedback opportunities for students. A three-level grievance redressal mechanism (department, college, and university levels) is established, with roles outlined in the college handbook. Answer scripts are stored securely for future reference, and internal mark lists are prepared for student

monitoring of attendance and performance.

Additionally, students can improve their scores through designated improvement exams. To maintain academic integrity, CCTVs are installed in examination halls. Various assessment methods are encouraged, including quizzes and online assignments. Internal mark forms are systematically prepared and validated before submission to the university portal. Open house programs facilitate discussions on academic performance, ensuring comprehensive student engagement in the assessment process.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time-bound and efficient

Santhigiri College has established a transparent, time-bound, and efficient mechanism to address internal examination-related grievances. Following the evaluation of various internal assessment components, teachers discuss the results with students, providing constructive feedback to help them understand their performance and areas for improvement. This open dialogue ensures that students gain clarity on their marks and the evaluation criteria. Additionally, teachers are available to address any queries or concerns students may have, promoting a supportive environment for academic growth. This feedback process enhances fairness and accountability, reinforcing students' trust in the internal assessment system and aiding in their continuous improvement.

The institution implements a Three-Level Grievance Redressal Mechanism to address student concerns effectively. Students can submit a Grievance Redressal Application Form for any issues related to Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) marks.

Students initially approach Level 1, the Department Level, chaired by the Head of the Department. If grievances remain unresolved the students can approach the College Level, where a committee led by the principal. Finally, Level 3 is the University Level, which involves a committee chaired by the

Vice-Chancellor. This structured approach ensures that students have multiple avenues for redressal, promoting a fair and transparent educational environment.

Each department has developed Programme Outcomes (POs) and Programme Specific Outcomes (PSOs) aligned with the learning objectives in the university syllabus. POs outline the essential knowledge, skills, and attitudes graduates should possess upon completion, while PSOs detail the specific competencies expected from graduates of each program. Course Outcomes (COs) are defined in consultation with faculty and specify what students should achieve by studying individual courses.

The Mahatma Gandhi University website displays POs, PSOs, and COs for postgraduate programs, while undergraduate programs; COs, POs and PSOs are created by departments, as these are not included in the syllabus. The well-defined outcomes help students meet industry standards and develop necessary skills and knowledge.

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) organizes workshops on Outcome-Based Education (OBE) to familiarize faculty with Bloom's Taxonomy and outcome mapping. POs, PSOs, and COs are outlined in the student manual and explained during departmental orientation meetings.

To measure attainment levels, the institution formally defines outcomes, setting a minimum of five COs per course. Achievement is evaluated through various assessment methods, with numerical values assigned to track student progress and program effectiveness, facilitating targeted improvements for future academic planning.

2.6.2 - Attainment of Programme outcomes and course outcomes are evaluated by the institution.

The institution utilizes the Accredited 360 software to map Course Outcomes (COs) to Programme Outcomes (POs) and Programme Specific Outcomes (PSOs) through CO-PO and CO-PSO matrices. This comprehensive tool generates consolidated mapping and attainment levels for each course within a program, allowing for precise evaluation at the end of each semester.

Accredited 360 features a well-defined Outcome-Based Education (OBE) evaluation method, including a mark sheet, mapping sheet, and output sheet. The mark sheet consolidates results for internal and external assessments, where internal marks are calculated based on attendance, assignments, and internal exams, following a 20:80 weightage ratio.

Attainment levels are categorized as follows: Level 0 (Not Attained), Level 1 (50% of students meet the cut-off), Level 2 (60% meet the cut-off), and Level 3 (70% meet the cut-off). The mapping sheet assesses CO-PO and CO-PSO correlations on a scale from 1 to 3, indicating slight to substantial contributions.

At the semesters end, course outcomes and attainment levels are analysed by subject in-charges and discussed in departmental meetings to inform future improvements and remedial actions. This structured approach ensures continuous enhancement of educational quality.

The broadband connections currently in use are Kerala Vision with a speed of 300 Mbps, and the Jio connection comes with a speed of 50 Mbps. The BSNL connection, which is an NMECT connection (as part of the National Mission for Education provided by the central government to educational institutions), comes with a speed of 10 Mbps. Depending on the nature of the construction, the Planning Committee presents the proposal before the staff and PTA for their concurrence, and the Managing Board takes the final decision. A purchase committee is established to gear the infrastructure development. The service of an electrician and a plumber is made available on campus. Computers are properly serviced and reused. The maintenance of computer hardware and software is carried out by third-party experts through annual maintenance contracts. At the end of the academic sessions, the heads of departments give a report on the working status of the equipment used in their departments. Santhigiri College's Arts Cell, in collaboration with different cells, organized JYOTHIRGAMAYA 2024, a four-day Arts Festival. The event aimed to showcase students' creativity and talents through 41 events, including off-stage (February 5th and 6th) and on-stage (February 8th and 9th) performances at the Indoor Stadium, Main Auditorium, Seminar Hall, and classrooms. Santhigiri conducts regular performance appraisals for faculty and non-teaching staff to enhance quality and effectiveness. At the start of each academic year, faculty receives a Teacher's

Manual outlining responsibilities, lesson plans, and self-appraisal forms. Faculty completes these forms every semester, which are reviewed by department heads and submitted to the Principal for evaluation. Students provide confidential feedback once per semester through an online/offline system, with the Principal reviewing scores, particularly if they fall below 2.5. Peer evaluations also offer confidential feedback on teaching performance. Self-appraisals, mandatory for all faculty, cover teaching methods, compliance, and community involvement, with the Principal compiling a report on strengths and areas for improvement, shared during management meetings. Based on appraisal results, the Faculty Excellence Award is presented annually to recognize outstanding contributions in teaching, research, mentoring, and community service. The Extra Mile Award is also given to faculty who demonstrate exceptional organizational citizenship behavior. Non-teaching staff are evaluated annually through surveys and informal meetings, with the principal monitoring performance and addressing issues as needed. Both faculty and non-teaching staff are encouraged to engage in professional development opportunities to continuously enhance their skills and effectiveness, reinforcing the institution's commitment to fostering a supportive and growth-oriented environment

accounts are opened by the project investigators. These accounts are also audited internally, with external auditors reviewing the documents upon project completion for submission to the respective funding agencies.

An external audit is conducted annually by a Chartered Accountant appointed by the Managing Board. At the start of the financial year, the Bursar prepares a detailed budget proposal, covering income and expenses for all departments, which is submitted to the management for approval. After reviewing and correcting any discrepancies, the external auditor provides a consolidated audit report. All utilization certificates are signed off by the Chartered Accountant. No major audit objections have been raised during the year, confirming the institution's commitment to financial integrity and compliance.
