DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE

• Webinar on Opportunities for Competent Students and International Scholarships the Department of Commerce organized a webinar called Graduate to introduce final-year

DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL WORK

- The department made the decision to regularly host various workshops and seminars. Students are encouraged to take part in intercollegiate sports and cultural events such as department day, sports day, and arts day each year in order to increase their exposure and acquire new skills and information.
- In order to help students secure internships and observation visits, the college took the initiative to get in touch with reputable organizations. This helped the students get placed in a variety of organizations.
- The department provided the students with a range of training sessions, webinars, and seminars. Students had exposure to a variety of topics and enhanced their proficiency through the sessions led by placement experts for the development of technical and competitive abilities.

DEPARTMENT OF ANIMATION AND GRAPHIC DESIGN

- Department offered cutting-edge teaching methods that are customized to meet the needs of our students in order to overcome any difficulties they may encounter in understanding particular ideas or skills. In order to provide a more dynamic and interesting learning environment, this means incorporating extra exercises, group projects, and online tutorials into our curriculum.
- Department understand the value of bringing in outside experts to offer further training and direction when our current teaching staff is inadequately versed in a particular area of expertise.



- To increase the breadth of knowledge our students can acquire, this may entail scheduling seminars, inviting special guests to speak, or allowing access to internet resources.
- Department actively promoted student collaboration on learning opportunities in order to fill in any gap in the curriculum and advance a more thorough animation syllabus. Studies show that group instruction greatly enhances student enthusiasm, engagement, and learning results overall.
- To promote a collaborative culture across the curriculum, department incorporated discussion boards, group projects, and peer review exercises.
- Department dedicated to giving students the tools they need to make up for any shortcomings, realizing that sometimes they need a little extra help. Access to relevant textbooks, online tutorials, and other educational resources that concentrate on the subject areas or abilities that students might find difficult are all included in this.

DEPARTMENT OF MANAGEMENT STUDIES

- A number of skill development programs, including Soft Skill Development Training (Communication Skill), were offered by the Department of Management Studies as add-on courses.
- Students participated in training and placement sessions to improve their talents; these experiences gave them the knowledge and skills they needed to succeed in both their personal and professional life.
- Students engage with alumni to build a useful connection between current students and individuals who have successfully traversed comparable academic and professional trajectories.
- Weak students received remedial sessions.
- To promote understanding, empathy, and knowledge of mental health issues, students spend a day with mentally challenged patients.





- The department implemented a number of innovative teaching strategies, such as reflective projects and gamification-based instruction, to increase student engagement and help them apply what they learned to real-world situations.
- To close the gap between theory and reality, courses on therapies like CBT were held.
- Additional topics were introduced in the form of group discussions, add-on courses, and other events beyond what was required by the university syllabus.
- Students who needed more help were given remedial classes.
- Students were introduced to a variety of online tools, including the swayam NPTEL courses, and the APA online laboratory.



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
