
Jail visit


Oppam


Seminar on Digital Banking Awareness

platform for students to showcase their talents and encouraged artistic expression and appreciation among attendees.




Game Technology Workshop

Mental Health Day with a week



All Kerala Specially Abled Arts Festival












USHUS (A transition from new beginnings to newfound wisdom)

Tuberculosis Awareness Campaign:






Child Development and Child Marriage


Field Survey for Farmers
